Expecting the Unexpected

This is my family's first winter in Covington. Since we moved here from South Carolina, we knew that it would be a different kind of winter than what we have been used to – colder, more snow, and more unpredictability.

One thing we have learned that is different about Virginia weather is that it varies. It can be cold one day and warm the next. It can be rainy one moment, and then sunny the next, and then rainy again. In short, to cope with this kind of weather, one has to expect the unexpected.

It's kind of like our faith lives. Like the weather, we try to get an idea of what is going to happen in the future. But it's difficult sometimes, because things change and unexpected events crop up. Sometimes, when we simply have no idea what is going to happen next, we can only rely on God. Only God knows the future. Our calling is to have faith that God is in control and that things will work out according to God's plan.

This is why, when we pray the Lord's Prayer each Sunday, we don't say, "God, please do things the way I want them. Please give me what I'm asking for." We simply say, "Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

And here's the good news. The good news is that often the unexpected things that God does are very positive and beneficial things. We can feel blessings more and more each day if we can open ourselves to expecting the unexpected, and following in God's will.

ORGAN RESTORATION IS UNDERWAY

Work to restore McAllister Memorial's pipe organ began Friday, January 24, 2020 with Thomas Rohlfs of Rohlfs Pipe Organ Services, LLC disconnecting the wind supply from the Great division of the organ. This will mute the pipes controlled by the lower manual (keyboard) of the organ. The Swell (upper keyboard) and the Pedal divisions of the organ are not affected and remain fully useable. Preparation was also made Friday for the removal of the Great pipework next week. Pipe removal is expected to take place on Thursday, January 30th.

The restoration of the organ is planned for five phases over a span of eight months. The phases will address the Great, the Swell and the Pedal Divisions of the organ with removal of the pipes, cleaning, repair and tuning, Schwimmer restoration, site work in preparation for return of the pipes, replacement of slider motors, reinstallation of the pipes and on-site tuning. The three wind system reservoirs supplying air to the organ will be restored and a capture system will be installed.

Church members will be informed of progress through the bulletin and the church's newsletter.

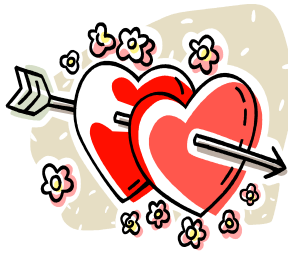

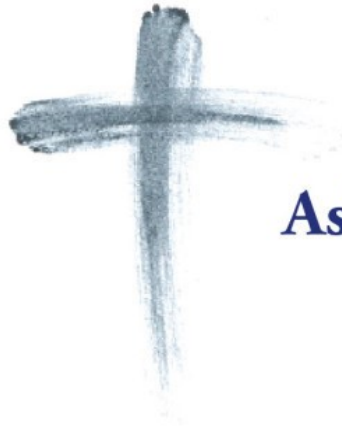

The Music that allows us to send loved ones on to their eternal life with a chorus of ‘Hallelujah!’

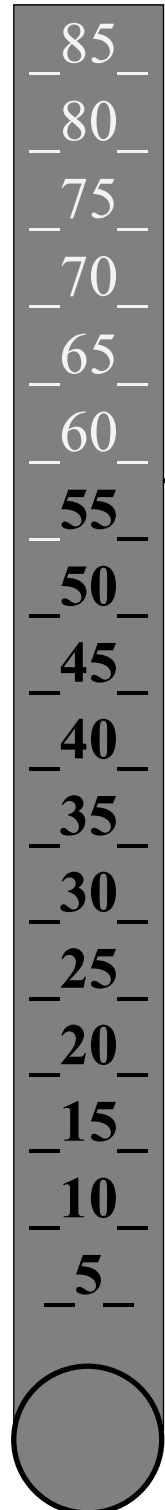
The Music that lives on eternally in the heavenly chorus that has some pretty prominent members from McAllister.

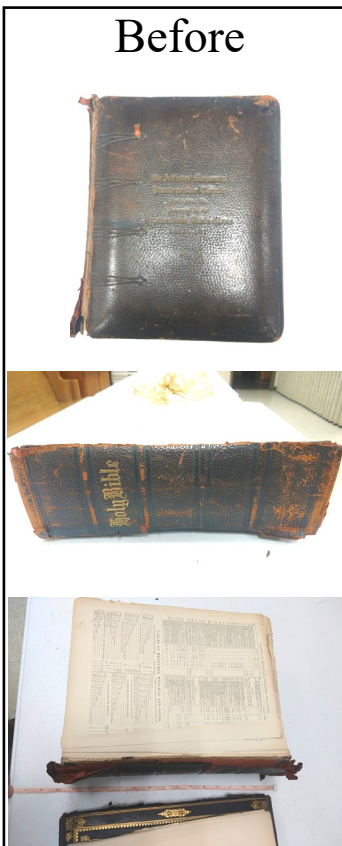

Restored Bible Dedicated

Dedication of the restored pulpit Bible took place on December 28, 2019. The restoration was dedicated in memory of Cecil and Delilah Ervin, long-time members of McAllister Church. Those participating in the service were their daughters, Brenda Linkenhoker and Teresa Wulff; grandchildren, Rebecca Gudgeon, Sara Nicely, Nathaniel and Zoe Wulff; and great grandchildren, Andy and Sophie Gudgeon, and Olivia and Amelia Nicely. Their son-in-law, Paul Linkenhoker delivered the message.

The idea for the restoration started after the 100th Anniversary Celebration in December 2018 when several members discovered the Bible was literally coming apart at the seams. Session approved the establishment of a restoration fund and made inquiries to find a restorer. With the help of Byron Faidley a restoration company was found and the Bible was delivered to them in March 2019.

With restoration complete and housed in a custom archival box, the Bible returned to McAllister in October 2019. Thanks to the efforts of those who were involved in this project this Bible will be around for another century or more.
