
McAllister's Livestreaming Survey Results

Most Respondents Watch At 11 O'Clock on Sunday

Just over 95% of survey respondents watch our Sunday morning worship service online.

Seventy one percent of those who watch are watching during the 11 o'clock hour on Sunday. Just under 48% watch during the live service and again later. Nearly 30% watch outside the 11 o'clock hour when it works with their schedule.

Most respondents report watching the service from start to end, while 19% prefer to skip around watching different parts of the service but do not watch straight through.

Satisfaction Is High Despite Varied Quality Ratings

The survey showed respondents to be generally very satisfied with the quality of the experience with the livestreamed Sunday worship service. However, when asked to rate the quality of video, sound, stability, ease of access, and overall experience with the broadcast, the responses were more varied ranging from fair to excellent.

Sound Can Be Wonky

Sound appears to show the greatest variability in ratings based on responses. "Sometimes, the sound is wonky. It is lie [like] someone is in a barrel," says one respondent. Another adds, "Sound quality seems to drop on a regular basis partway through the message (i.e., feed back or an echo effect) but returns to normal before the end of the service."

Facebook Audio Issues

Researching ways to improve sound quality online one quickly finds that sound quality on Facebook is often a point of dissatisfaction. People commonly say it's a Facebook problem and not an equipment problem due to how Facebook handles and processes live feeds. Facebook is not alone in this as people also report similar issues with livestreaming on YouTube. Still, the research has brought to light a few things to try that might help the sound. The fact that we are using OBS software to

stream appears to be a positive as many reported better sound quality using OBS than other options. We understand from the feedback that sound is an area where we can continue to look for improvement.

Quality Is A Result Of Many Variables

Personally, we have experienced poor sound when watching one of our livestreamed services at home only to find the sound quality to be good when next watching the same service. Sound can vary viewing to viewing. Bandwidth, speed, buffering and the quality of service provided by the internet provider may also be a factor affecting not only the quality of sound but also the quality of the overall experience.

Can View When I Want

One respondent says, "I enjoy the ability to view the worship service wherever I am and at any time that fits my schedule."
