

A Word from Your Pastor—The Dog Days of Summer

For the past several weeks, we have been in what is known as "the dog days of summer." We have seen temperatures regularly climb up into the low-to-mid nineties. It has been so hot that we don't want to do any outdoor activities. We just want to stay inside where it is cool and we can get out of the burning sun.

These "dog days" remind me of a mission trip that I went on when I was in high school. During the heat of July, we travelled to the Mexican town of Ciudad Miguel Alleman — which is right across the border from McAllen, Texas. We went to help build a church.

Our main task that week was to lay cement blocks that would form the walls of the church and its various classrooms. We were far from being experts at laying the blocks, but we had a couple of expert craftsmen from the town helping. One was a man named Patricio.


Patricio would stay out in the dry Mexican heat – over 100 degrees on several days we were there – and tirelessly help instruct us in how to lay the blocks. He didn't speak English, and none us really spoke Spanish – but Patricio didn't let the language barrier get in the way of educating us. He would patiently demonstrate how to get just enough cement on your trowel, how to slide it onto the edge of the block below, and then how to place the new block on top and get it level. It must have been comical at times, as Patricio showed us again and again how to lay those blocks, until we kind of got the hang of what we were doing.

Patricio's tireless patience that he showed us reminds us of the tireless patience that is the grace of God. Just like we as amateur masons kept messing up while trying to lay those cement blocks, we as Christians keep messing up when it comes to our lives and following Christ. And just as Patricio never tired of showing us how to do it right, God never tires of forgiving us and showing us the right way to live. Even in the hottest "dog days of summer," when our sinfulness threatens to burn us — Christ is there with the cooling waters of forgiveness.

So whenever we get to these "dog days," I think about that blazing hot mission trip. I think about Patricio's tireless patience. And I think about God's amazing patience with us that is shown through the grace of Jesus Christ. During this heat, may we all feel it's cooling touch.

Scars for Life

Some years ago on a hot summer day in south Florida, a little boy decided to go for a swim in the old swimming hole behind his house. In a hurry to dive into the cool water, he ran out the back door, leaving behind shoes, socks, and shirt as he went. He flew into the water, not realizing that as he swam toward the middle of the lake, an alligator was swimming toward the shore.

His mother in the house was looking out the window saw the two as they got closer and closer together. In utter fear, she ran toward the water, yelling to her son as loudly as she could. Hearing her voice, the little boy became alarmed and made a U-turn to swim to his mother. It was too late. Just as he reached her, the alligator reached him.

From the dock, the mother grabbed her little boy by the arms just as the alligator snatched his legs. That began an incredible tug-of-war between the two. The alligator was much stronger than the mother, but the mother was much too passionate to let go.

A farmer happened to drive by, heard her screams, raced from his truck, took aim and shot the alligator. Remarkably, after weeks and weeks in the hospital, the little boy survived. His legs were extremely scarred by the vicious attack of the animal. And, on his arms, were deep scratches where his mother's fingernails dug into his flesh in her effort to hang on to the son she loved.

The newspaper reporter who interviewed the boy after the trauma, asked if he would show him his scars. The boy lifted his pant legs. And then, with obvious pride, he said to the reporter, "But look at my arms. I have great scars on my arms, too. I have them because my Mom wouldn't let go." You and I can identify with that little boy. We have scars, too. No, not from an alligator, or anything quite so dramatic. But the scars of a painful past. Some of those scars are unsightly and have caused us deep regret. But, some wounds, my friend, are because God has refused to let go.

In the midst of your struggle, He's been there holding on to you. The Scripture teaches that God loves you. You are a child of God. He wants to protect you and provide for you in every way.

But sometimes we foolishly wade into dangerous situations. The swimming hole of life is filled with peril - and we forget that the enemy is waiting to attack. That's when the tug-of-war begins - and if you have the scars of His love on your arms be very, very grateful. He did not and will not - let you go.
