~A Word From Your Pastor~

What Is So Good About Good Friday?

It's hard to believe, but Holy Week is almost upon us. This is the time when we celebrate the events of Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem (on Palm Sunday); his Last Supper with his disciples and his arrest (on Maundy Thursday); his persecution and his execution on the cross (on Good Friday); and his resurrection from the dead (on Easter Sunday).

It is a week full of mystery and questioning – but perhaps one of the biggest questions we will ask is, "Why is it is called Good Friday? What is so good about it?" The answer to this question lets us know why this is such an important day on the Christian calendar.

Based on what happened on that day, it doesn't seem good at all. This is the day that Jesus was persecuted. The day he was hung on the cross in shame. And the day he died a very painful death up on that cross. In the moment, there was nothing good about day. Beyond the immediate pain and suffering that Jesus endured, the cross represents the sin that we are all guilty of, and how our sin drove Jesus to that cross.

So how did this terrible day become good? How did God bring something positive out of something that seems so very negative? The answer lies in the fact that Jesus went voluntarily to the cross. As the Son of God, he had the power to free himself and spare himself from the suffering of the cross. But in his great love for us, he chose to die that painful death.

In going voluntarily to the cross, Jesus took our place. He exonerated us from the guilt of our sin. He forgave us. And that is what is so good about Good Friday. It is the day that Jesus bore our sins in his body, the day that God's grace was poured out over all our sin.

On Good Friday this year, we will be joining First Presbyterian in their sanctuary for a special service (April 15 at 5:00 pm). I encourage each of you to come, and hear this terrible but good story once again. I also encourage you to come to our Maundy Thursday Communion service, which will be at 7:00 pm in our sanctuary.

We will have the following special services for Holy Week. Please join us as we celebrate the solemn and beautiful events of the crucifixion and resurrection.

- Palm Sunday worship. (April 10, 11:00 am) Come and get your palm and wave it in celebration of the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ the King! We will also look toward the solemn events of the Last Supper and the cross.
- Maundy Thursday service. (April 14, 7:00 pm) Join us for Communion as we commemorate the Last Supper and the arrest of Jesus Christ. At the end of the service, we will do the traditional stripping of the church, a very powerful and symbolic event.
- Good Friday service. (April 15, 5:00 pm) Join us at First Presbyterian as we remember the terrible events of Jesus' persecution and his death on the cross. Many people consider this the most powerful worship service of the year.
- Easter Sunrise service (April 17, 7:00 am) Held at Cliffside Golf Club, this service features the youth of our church as we remember the events of the empty tomb.
- Easter worship (April 17, 11:00 am) We will join our hearts in celebration of the resurrection! Join us for special music, liturgy, and an Easter sermon.

- All children up through 3rd grade are invited for a special Easter Egg Hunt. It will be held in the Fellowship Hall on Good Friday (April 15) at 2:00 pm. 
## Steeple Update

## Musical Minute:



In 1997 Andy and I had the opportunity to spend a meaningful and memorable (it was so cold!) Easter in the city of Cracow (Kraków), Poland. For years we'd been told of the beauty of the city and its importance in Polish history, and we finally decided to take a three-day weekend to investigate this jewel about 200 miles from our home in the Czech Republic.

At the time we visited, Pope John Paul II, the first Pole ever elected to the papacy was still in the Vatican. Easter is a huge celebration in predominantly Catholic Poland anyway, but the fact that a native son was the current Pope made the seasonal joy in Cracow even more palpable. There were banners featuring the Pope's benevolent countenance throughout town and excitement pervaded the atmosphere as individuals and families prepared for the upcoming festivities. All day Saturday and throughout the evening, we saw streams of people carrying baskets, pouring in and out of the many churches around the city center. (Wikipedia states that there are at least 120 Catholic Churches in Cracow.) Holding items for the Easter feast the following day the baskets were brought to the church to be blessed by the priest. In addition to decorated hard-boiled eggs (pisanki in Polish), ham, smoked sausage, horseradish root and other traditional foodstuffs, a requisite item in the basket was the traditional Easter babka, a sort of turban-shaped, ridged, slightly sweetened (and delicious) yeast cake baked in a traditional babka (bob-ka) mold. I was happily introduced to babka when I married into Andy's family and babka and I have been good friends ever since! We have the recipe that Andy's mother used, made all the more special because it was given to her by a dear family friend. Andy makes beautiful babkas and over the years I have also learned to make his mom's babka. Any of you who are accustomed to working with yeast dough will find the recipe very approachable. As with many yeast breads, there is a bit of time involved (most of it resting time for the dough), but the technique itself is not difficult, especially if you have a sturdy mixer (which I am quite certain most Polish housewives throughout the centuries did not have!). Anyway—if you're feeling up to some "armchair" travel and a little work in the kitchen, I present you (see insert) with the recipe for Anna Monseu Dreszer's Easter Babka, courtesy of the Dreszer's longtime family friend, Sally Mroczek. If it turns out well, and it absolutely should, you can bring it by the church and maybe Pastor Jim will bless it for you!
